HOW TO ACCESS THE WEB SERVICE

The ONIX REST API exists in two separate environments, each with their own server, code and database. Please use the web service located at **onix.qa.pubhub.dk** when developing and testing! Please request a new license key for the production environment when you're ready to go live.

Attention: Use SSL/https in production!

The ebooks and audiobooks are available through download from <ftp://ftp.pubhub.dk> / <http://audiozipper.pubhub.dk> (see <WebsiteLink> in ONIX). Please request license key and FTP username + password from Publizon. As of Api version 1.7 besides the mp3 files a new JSON audio manifest file with information about chapter beginnings is included in the zip file if any chapters are defined for the audiobook.

DATAFLOW DESCRIPTION

The ONIX REST API returns product metadata in the ONIX format¹. This metadata contains links to media files, that is e-books (epub/pdf), audiobooks (zip) and covers (jpg/png).

First you need to retrieve *all products* using the endpoint `/v[X]/products` (where [X] is the current version of the API). We call this the **alpha-pull**.

Subsequently you need to retrieve updates (that is new, changed and deleted products) regularly (we recommend 00:30 CET each day, because the API will begin refreshing its cache at 00:05 CET) using the same endpoint as described above (`/v[X]/products`) but with the parameter `fromUtc=[YYYY-MM-DDTHH:MM:SS]`. We call this the **delta-pulls**.

The following example illustrates a delta-pull:

<https://onix.pubhub.dk/v8/products/?fromUtc=2020-01-19T23:30:00>

(with your license key as a request header, see next chapter for details).

This call will return all products that have been updated since the supplied datetime-stamp (here 2020-01-19 23:30 UTC!).

When you have successfully retrieved and imported all products, we recommend that you store the date and time where you called the API. This way you know that you have all data up to this point. Next time you make a delta-pull you then use the stored datetime-stamp as `fromUtc`.

Here's an example of the flow:

API call datetime	Endpoint	Type
2020-01-19 23:30:00 UTC	<code>/v[X]/products</code>	Alpha-pull
2020-01-20 23:30:00 UTC	<code>/v[X]/products/?fromUtc=2020-01-19T23:30:00</code>	Delta-pull
2020-01-21 23:30:00 UTC	<code>/v[X]/products/?fromUtc=2020-01-20T23:30:00</code>	Delta-pull
2020-01-22 23:30:00 UTC	<code>/v[X]/products/?fromUtc=2020-01-21T23:30:00</code>	Delta-pull

Please notice:

- Currently it's not possible to see if a media file (referenced by a link) has changed. So please always download the media files.
- The value of the `timestamp` attribute on the Product element in the ONIX output is the date and time where either metadata or files was last updated – it is NOT the date and time where it was added to or removed from you as a receiver so please do not use this timestamp to determine if you should create/update/remove the product in your end! If for instance the API returns 5 products when calling the API with a given `fromUtc` date you should create/update/remove all 5 products in your end even though a timestamp value is prior to the `fromUtc` date and time.

HOW TO DOWNLOAD AUDIOBOOK

Use the HTTP URL in the xml element Product/ProductSupply/SupplyDetail/Supplier/Website/WebsiteLink to download the audiobook. Use a GET request with the header “x-service-key: [license key]” (like when you call the endpoint to retrieve the onix data).

Example:

```
GET http://audiozipper.pubhub.dk/v1/wm/11111111-2222-3333-4444-555555555555.zip  
x-service-key: AAAAAAAA-BBBB-CCCC-DDDD-EEEEEEEEEEEE
```

Attention: This URL and license key is only an example.

Most audiobooks are big (>100 MB) so it will take some time to download depending on your download speed.

HOW TO DOWNLOAD EBOOK

Use the FTP URL in the xml element Product/ProductSupply/SupplyDetail/Supplier/Website/WebsiteLink to download the e-book. Use the FTP credentials (user + password) supplied from Publizon to download.

Attention: You are not able to see and download files through a normal GUI-based FTP client because there is only read (and not list) access to the e-book files you have rights to.

Below are three examples of how to download an e-book file.

(For security reasons credentials and actual file paths have been removed)

1) Using wget
